**PAUL THE APOSTLE TO
TIMOTHY**
2 Tim. 2:1-10

2:1. Thou therefore, my son, be strong in Christ Jesus: **2:2.** And the things which thou hast heard of me by many witnesses, the same commend to faithful men who shall be fit to teach others also. **2:3.** Labour as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. **2:4.** No man, being a soldier to God, entangleth himself with secular businesses: that he may please him to whom he hath engaged himself. **2:5.** For he also that striveth for the mastery is not crowned, except he strive lawfully. **2:6.** The husbandman that laboureth must first partake of the fruits. **2:7.** Understand what I say: for the Lord will give thee in all things understanding. **2:8.** Be mindful that the Lord Jesus Christ is risen again from the dead, of the seed of David, according to my gospel: **2:9.** Wherein I labour even unto

bands, as an evildoer. But the word of God is not bound. **2:10.** Therefore I endure all things for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus, with heavenly glory.

**+ THE CONTINUATION OF
THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO SAINT
MATTHEW**

Mat. 27:33-54

27:33. And they came to the place that is called Golgotha, which is the place of Calvary. **27:34.** And they gave him wine to drink mingled with gall. And when he had tasted, he would not drink. **27:35.** And after they had crucified him, they divided his garments, casting lots; that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying: They divided my garments among them; and upon my vesture they cast lots. **27:36.** And they sat and watched him. **27:37.** And they put over his head his cause written: **THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS.** **27:38.** Then were crucified with him two thieves: one on the right hand and one on the left. **27:39.** And they that passed by blasphemed him, wagging their heads, **27:40.** And saying: Vah, thou that destroyest the temple of God and in three days dost rebuild it: save

thy own self. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross. **27:41.** In like manner also the chief priests, with the scribes and ancients, mocking said: **27:42.** He saved others: himself he cannot save. If he be the king of Israel, let him now come down from the cross: and we will believe him. **27:43.** He trusted in God: let him now deliver him if he will have him. For he said: I am the Son of God. **27:44.** And the selfsame thing the thieves also that were crucified with him reproached him with. **27:45.** Now from the sixth hour, there was darkness over the whole earth, until the ninth hour. **27:46.** And about the ninth hour, Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying: Eli, Eli, lamma sabacthani? That is, My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me? **27:47.** And some that stood there and heard said: This man calleth Elias. **27:48.** And immediately one of them running took

a sponge and filled it with vinegar and put it on a reed and gave him to drink. 27:49. And the others said: Let be. Let us see whether Elias will come to deliver him. 27:50. And Jesus again crying with a loud voice, yielded up the ghost. 27:51. And behold the veil of the temple was rent in two from the top even to the bottom: and the earth quaked and the rocks were rent. 27:52. And the graves were opened: and many bodies of the saints that had slept arose, 27:53. And coming out of the tombs after his resurrection, came into the holy city and appeared to many. 27:54. Now the centurion and they that were with him watching Jesus, having seen the earthquake and the things that were done, were sore afraid, saying: Indeed this was the Son of God.
